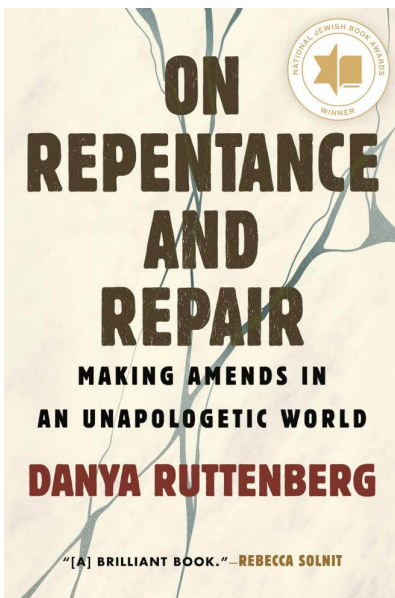

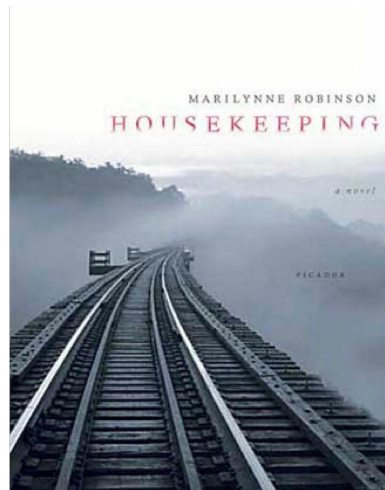
Book Discussion Group News Tuesday, September 12, at 6 p.m.

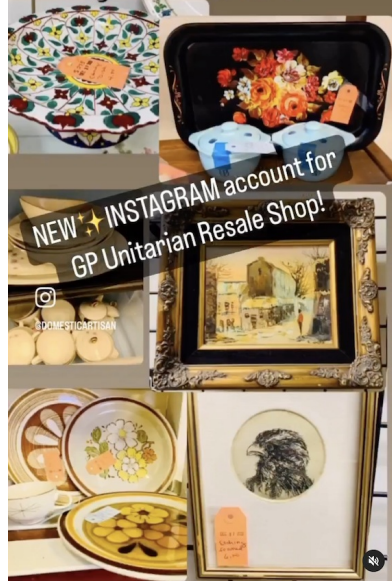

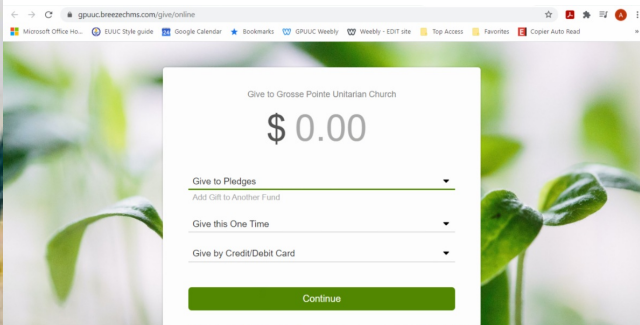
Upon checking out, ***Breeze will give you the option to cover the processing fee.*** The processing fee will provide you with credit towards your total tax-deductible giving for the year
