# Alexander's Meander





Stop the Bleed Campaign Stop the Bleed is a national awareness campaign and call-toaction. It is intended to cultivate grassroots efforts that encourage bystanders to become trained, equipped, and empowered to help

in a bleeding emergency before professional help arrives.


#### Save A Life

- The focus of this program is on:
- The immediate response to bleeding
- Recognize life-threatening bleeding
- Appropriate ways to stop the bleeding

• The help given by an immediate responder can often make the difference between life and death, even before professional rescuers arrive. With the right training, YOU can help save lives!

#### Why YOU need this training

- · Work-related Injuries
- Home Injuries
- Motor vehicle crashes
- Natural disasters
- Active-shooter events



- Ensure your own safety
- The ABCs of Bleeding
  - A Alert call 9-1-1
  - B Bleeding find the bleeding injury
  - C Compress apply pressure to stop the bleeding by:
    - 1. Covering the wound with a clean cloth and applying pressure by pushing directly on it with both hands, OR
    - 2. Using a tourniquet, OR
    - Packing (filling) the wound with gauze or a clean cloth and then applying pressure with both hands

Personal Safety

- · Before you offer any help, you must remain safe
- · If you become injured, you will not be able to help the victim
- · Initiate care if the scene is safe for you to do so
- If, at any time, your safety is threatened, attempt to remove yourself from danger and find a safe location
- Protect yourself from blood-borne infections by wearing gloves, if available
