Announcement Regarding Sunday Service Mask Policy

Dear Congregants,

It has been two years since the pandemic was declared, and our church began to worship on zoom and "mask up" to keep our beloved community safe. Throughout the pandemic, we have monitored the COVID case positivity rates closely to determine whether we could congregate safely, but have always asked you to wear a mask in the building.

We are excited to announce that we have lifted the mask requirement for Sunday services. With Wayne County's positivity rate dipping below 2%, we believe the time is right for this change. We will continue to monitor the Covid positivity rates and make science-based decisions if there are future surges. *It remains a requirement that all attendees are vaccinated and boosted for Covid.* We understand that some congregants will be more comfortable

wearing masks when attending worship in person, and we will make N95 masks available for anyone that would like one. We will also continue to offer zoom services.

When visiting the church or meeting in smaller groups, we ask that congregants respect the wishes of others and continue to mask up if that is preferred by anyone in the group. All people entering the church are still expected to be fully vaccinated and boosted.

Sunday, May 8 is Mother's Day! The first Mother's Day was started by a tiny, red-haired, woman named **Julia Ward Howe**, who lived from 1819-1910. She was a Unitarian who started the special day for all women, all over the world to work for PEACE. She believed that mothers should step up in the matters of wars. She believed in leaders using peaceful ways to settle problems. She started a festival which she named "Mother's Day," and she chose June 2 as the day of celebration. In 1906 a woman named Anna Jarvis proposed that Mother's Day be

celebrated on a different day and the US Congress settled the matter by voting in 1913 for Mother's Day to be the second Sunday in May. Julia Ward Howe is best remembered for writing the famous song, "The Battle Hymn of the Republic" and for her stance against slavery. Julia wrote a Mother's Day Proclamation that you can read at
